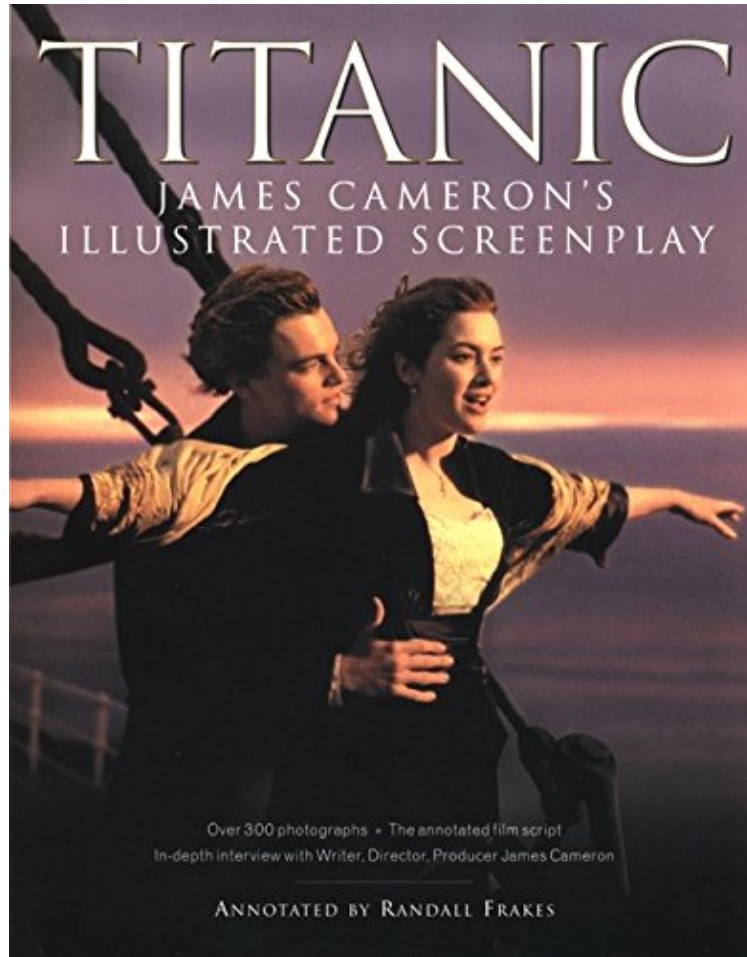

Even if you can quote the whole movie at this point and can admit some parts are cheesy. It contains the full original screenplay, including the deleted scenes and several notes and explanations that might answer nagging questions you've always had about the plot or why scenes were cut. It has lots of full-page photos too, and often references the real facts about the disaster and how they were adapted for the movie.I've been fascinated by the Titanic since years before the movie, so I appreciate that most of the film faithfully reflected what we know about the passengers, voyage, and disaster (aside from the Rose and Jack plot, of course; the controversial, historically inaccurate final portrayal of 1st Officer William Murdoch; the 3rd class passengers getting \*deliberately\* locked below deck; and smaller things only Titanic buffs will notice.) The book gave me a greater appreciation for the work James Cameron put into his record-breaking modern-
