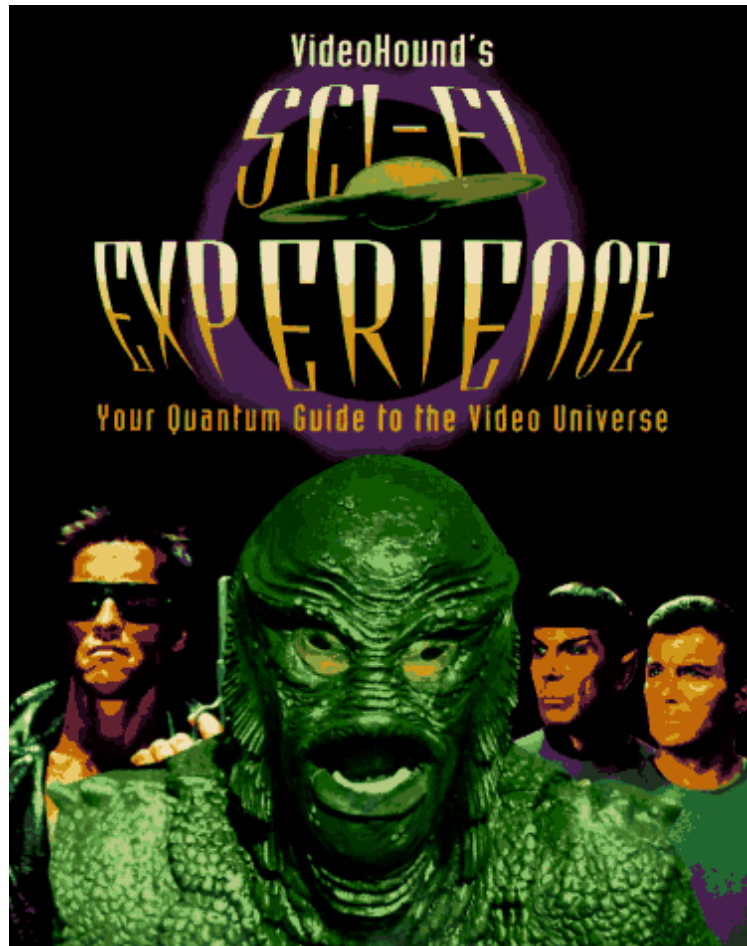

Even though the book predates DVD I am confident that the titles inside are available on DVD now, or at the very least still available somewhere on VHS, Beta, or Laserdisc. When you consider the brevity of the reviews for each movie they are surprisingly helpful and well-written, but this book is no simple movie guide. There are blurbs a-plenty spread throughout the text that contribute helpful, enlightening, entertaining, or otherwise playful information. There are also beautiful black white stills throughout. The book includes "Sci-Connections" and a Cast Index, Category List, Category Index (very helpful if you're looking for a particular theme or topic in a movie, like "Killer Apes" "Japanimation" "Virtual Reality," etc.), Distributor List, Distributor Index, Alternative Titles Index, and a Distributor Guide.
