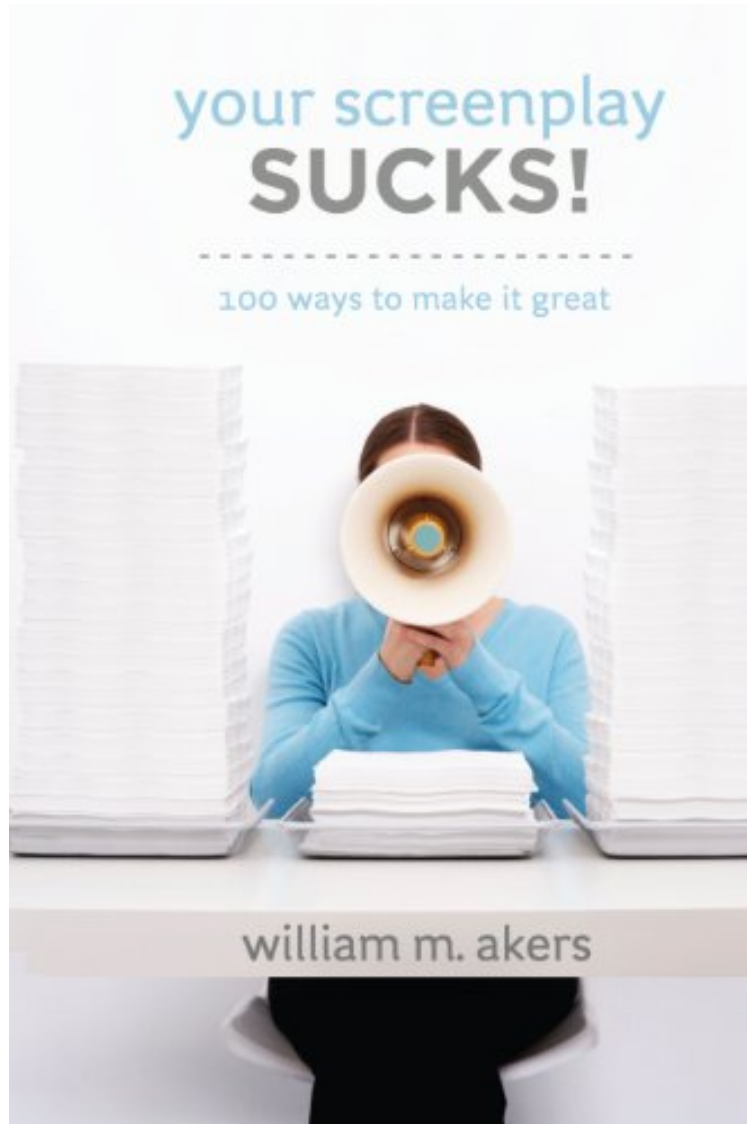

But what do you expect from a book that exists for the purpose of telling you how much you suck at writing? I wouldn't recommend this as a gift for your ten year old. There are some innuendos that may be inappropriate for children, but are also used in a way to help the reader understand writing. The jokes may go over a child's head, therefore confusing them, and it's also quite a bit weighty, but it's perfect for a fully grown adult with an antagonistic sense of humor -- and it's certainly not overrated like, say, an unnamed book about rescuing felines.
